This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report alleged that on 7/8/18, the mother lay down to take a nap at 3PM, placing the newborn male child face down on the mother's stomach. At 7PM, the mother and father realized the child was unresponsive. They called 911 and the child was transported to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased on 7/8/18. The child was otherwise healthy and died while in the care of both parents. The surviving male sibling (age 12) had an unknown role.

Executive Summary

This fatality report concerns the death of a 3-week-old male child (SC) that occurred on 7/8/18. A report was made to the SCR on 7/9/18. There was a 12-year-old male surviving sibling who was not in the home at the time of the incident.

Orange County Department of Social Services (OCDSS) coordinated efforts with law enforcement upon receipt of the fatality report. The family had no criminal history. An autopsy was performed; however, the Medical Examiner's report was pending at the time of this writing.

The mother reported taking the child with her and laying down for a nap around 6PM on 7/8/18. The mother laid on her back on the couch and placed the child face down on her stomach with his head turned to the side. The father was napping in another room and awoke at an unknown time. The father picked the child up and noticed the child was not moving or making any noise. The father noticed blood on the child's face; mother woke up and started screaming to call 911. Father called 911 and performed CPR per instructions from the 911 operator. EMS arrived and transported the child to the hospital where he was later pronounced dead at 8:11PM.

OCDSS gathered information about the child's death from the mother, father, law enforcement, the medical examiner, the hospital, and medical providers.

Multiple home visits were made and collaterals were interviewed. Burial assistance and trauma services were offered. The family participated briefly in family counseling and declined further services. The family had no CPS history. OCDSS completed required reports and safety assessments accurately and on time and conducted a thorough investigation. The case was closed and unfounded on 9/2/18.

LDSS Response

On 7/9/18, OCDSS received the fatality report from the SCR, initiated their investigation within 24 hours and coordinated efforts with LE. OCDSS contacted the source of the report, completed a CPS history check, and notified the ME and DA of the SC's death. The surviving sibling was assessed and safe.

On 7/9/18, CW made a home visit and spoke with the mother, father, the 12yo SS, and maternal grandmother. The mother gave her account of the day leading to the child's death. The mother said that on 7/8/18, she lay down with the child around 6PM. The mother laid on her back on the couch and placed the child face down on top of her, with his head turned to the side. The father said he was in the bedroom napping at the time. He said when he awoke, he saw the mother asleep on the couch with the child. He said he picked the child up and he did not make a sound or any movement and then he noticed blood on the child's face. The father woke the mother and she began screaming to call 911. The father called 911 and performed CPR per 911 instructions. The parents said EMS arrived and transported the child to the hospital. The parents reported they did not have any issues with drugs/alcohol, mental health, or domestic violence, and denied criminal histories. The mother said the child was born full term and there were no complications during labor or pregnancy. The parents were aware of safe sleep guidelines. The mother said the child was recently seen by his pediatrician on 7/5/18. The mother told CW the 12yo SS was at his father's home for the summer when this incident occurred. CW interviewed the 12yo SS and the child did not disclose any concerns for either parent. The mother gave CW a tour of the home and no hazards were noted. The CW offered the parents trauma services and funeral assistance. The mother agreed to the trauma services referral.

The CW completed a criminal history check and the parents had no criminal history. The CW obtained a copy of the 911 call, the incident report from the State Police, medical records from the hospital the child was transported to, birth records, and the child's pediatrician. The child's pediatric records noted no concerns.

There was a reenactment done at the home that was witnessed by the CW and the investigator from the ME's office. The CW spoke with the investigator afterwards who said there had been no signs of identified trauma so far.

CW confirmed the family had one family session with the local trauma services.

The CW met with the SS's father and he had no concerns regarding the mother. The CW also spoke with SS's school who



had no concerns with the mother and said she was a cooperative parent.

On 8/15/18, the CW made a final home visit and the family said they were no longer in need of any services; the mother was working with an online community of parents who had deceased children.

The CW spoke with the ME's office who said the report is most likely going to be "undetermined manner and cause of death." The ME said there could have been an underlying natural disease as there were signs of inflammation in the lungs and liver, but the cause of inflammation was unknown.
