This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:

- A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
- The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
- The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
- The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child’s family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child’s death; whether the child or the child’s family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child’s death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child’s death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child’s household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may **only** be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. **It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child’s siblings or other children in the household.**

OCFS’ review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS’ assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

Nassau County Department of Social Services (NCDSS) received a report alleging that on Tuesday, 5/31/22, between 7:50PM and 9:50PM, the father fell asleep on his bed next to the 4-week-old subject child. The father rolled over on top of the child, restricting his airway. At approximately 9:50PM, the child was found by his mother; not breathing, and without a pulse. The child was transported to the hospital by ambulance. The child was unable to be resuscitated on the way to the hospital. Attempts were made to resuscitate him at the hospital. At approximately 10:56PM, the subject child passed away.

Executive Summary

This report concerns the death of a 4-week-old male child. Nassau County Department of Social Services (NCDSS) received an SCR report regarding the subject child’s death on 5/31/22. At the time of his death, the subject child resided with his mother, father, and 3-year-old surviving sibling.

On the evening of 5/31/22, the father fed the child his last bottle and reported the last thing he remembered was burping the baby and lying on the couch with the child on his chest. The mother was upstairs with the sibling and when she came downstairs, approximately two hours later, she saw the baby on the couch on the father’s side. When the parents looked at the baby, the child had blood on his face and mouth and was unresponsive. The parents immediately called 911 and attempted CPR. Emergency medical services responded to the home and the child was transported to the hospital by ambulance. The child was unable to be resuscitated on the way to the hospital and attempts made at the hospital were unsuccessful. The child died at 10:56PM.

The medical examiner was notified and performed an autopsy. The preliminary cause of death was mechanical asphyxiation. Law enforcement responded to the scene and began an investigation. Law enforcement had not made any arrests and considered the event an accident at the time NCDSS closed their investigation.

NCDSS made several home visits and interviewed the parents and observed the sibling at daycare and at home. The sibling was assessed to be safe and remained in her parents’ care.

NCDSS substantiated the allegations against the father regarding the death of the child, citing the cause of death and that the father did not provide a safe sleep environment for the baby despite access to a portable crib nearby. The family was receptive to bereavement counseling referrals and at the close of the investigation both parents were in virtual counseling and the 3-year-old sibling was engaged in play therapy.

NCDSS conducted multiple home visits throughout the investigation, contacted relevant collaterals, and assessed for the sibling's safety. Supervisory consultation was documented, and the decision was made to substantiate the allegations in the report. The case was indicated and closed, and the sibling remained in her parents' care.

LDSS Response

On 5/31/22, NCDSS received an SCR report regarding the death of the subject child. NCDSS initiated their investigation within 24 hours and coordinated their efforts with LE. NCDSS contacted the source of the report, completed a CPS history check regarding the family, and notified the DA of the fatality. NCDSS assessed the safety of the surviving sibling at the hospital during the overnight hours, as well as at the case address and daycare the morning of 6/1/22.

NCDSS interviewed the parents regarding the events leading up to the child's death. The father reported he gave the last feeding to the child. He stated he was on the couch with the child on his chest and the last thing he remembered was burping the baby. The mother stated she was upstairs with the sibling, reading her a book at about 8:20PM and had fallen asleep. When she came downstairs at about 10:20PM, she stated the baby was on the father's side and there was blood on the baby's face and mouth. The mother woke the father. The parents called 911 and attempted CPR. The child was transported to the hospital by ambulance. Resuscitation efforts were unsuccessful, and he died. Discussions with the parents, as well as observations of the home environment, showed the child had access to safe sleep locations, which were a bassinet in the parent's bedroom and a portable crib on the main floor. NCDSS ascertained the parents were aware of safe sleeping guidelines as they reported they were educated at the time of the child's birth. The sibling's bedroom was observed, and no safety concerns were noted for the sibling.

NCDSS observed the sibling on multiple occasions, however, she was not interviewed due to her age. She is a 3-year-old who presented as shy with NCDSS. NCDSS spoke with collaterals, none of whom reported anything concerning regarding the care of the sibling and she was assessed safe in her parents' care.

NCDSS attempted to speak with the ME on multiple occasions, however, ultimately learned the cause of death from LE. LE reported, per the ME, the preliminary cause of death was mechanical asphyxiation. At the close of the investigation, the autopsy remained pending, and the ME did not provide information directly to NCDSS. LE found no criminality or signs of substance misuse by the parents.



NCDSS gathered information from collaterals, including the pediatrician, hospital staff, daycare, and LE. NCDSS learned that the child was seen on 5/31/22, the date of his death, by the pediatrician for a well-child visit. No medical concerns were noted, and the child appeared healthy at the visit. He had received a vaccination and was being treated for a deformed ear. Bereavement services were offered to the family, and they accepted and were engaged in counseling prior to the investigation closing. The sibling was deemed as safe, and no criminal charges were brought against either parent. NCDSS did find evidence to support the allegations in the report and substantiated all allegations against the father. The investigation was indicated and closed.
